





The UNM Office of Assessment is announcing a new university-wide initiative starting this fall -- UNM Institutional Assessment Day (IAD). The purpose of IAD is to receive feedback and gather information from students about how well the University is doing in ensuring that our students' academic experiences are positive. IAD will provide an opportunity for students to share their voices by taking online satisfaction surveys from various administrative and student support service departments that help answer questions such as: What is UNM doing well? What can be changed at UNM to make it more efficient and effective? Also, preselected students will have the opportunity to receive individual scores about how well they are learning compared to their peers and other institutions by taking assessments that measure the development of their Core general education skills and workforce skills. IAD is scheduled to occur on October 14th and 15th at the UNM-Main and UNM-Valencia campuses, and October 20th and 21st (tentative) at the UNM-Gallup and


